Following in the footsteps of early hypertext pioneers, we will focus on concepts, methodologies and tools for supporting knowledge workers. We invite scholars, researchers and practitioners from all disciplines to participate in this event and exchange ideas, theories and experiences regarding the use of hypermedia to augment the capabilities of knowledge workers.

As part of this interdisciplinary tradition, we have identified three closely-related communities on which to focus this year's program content. Although interdisciplinary work in any area is welcome, we are especially interested in the following:

- Hypermedia and Information Retrieval

In addition to interdisciplinary work describing the application of hypermedia concepts and technologies in other fields, we encourage submissions that address topics traditionally of interest within the hypermedia community, especially concerning one or more of the following themes:

- Adaptive and Adaptable Hypermedia
- Hypermedia Engineering
- Literary Hypermedia
- Ubiquitous and Physical Hypermedia
- Spatial Hypermedia
- Collaborative Hypermedia
- Time and Synchronisation in Hypermedia
- Hypermedia Systems and Structures
